From the Desk of the Chair, Mike Scott

February kicked off with the USA Cross Country Championships on February 3. The lure of warm temperatures and a fast course attracted some excellent talent to Tallahassee. Leonard Korir outkicked Galen Rupp to successfully defend his national cross country crown, while Emily Infield pulled away from Molly Seidel late in the race to win her first national title. Korir's and Infield's wins give them the early lead in the 208 USA Running Circuit standings.

Kevin Castille and Jennifer Bayliss were the first across the line in the Masters races, while Stanford's Connor Lane and Northern Illinois' Ashley Tutt won the U20 races.

That same day, Sabrina Little and Ronnie Delzer won the USATF 100 Mile Trail Championships in Huntsville, Texas,

Two weeks later, Jon Olsen and Traci Falbo won the USATF 100 Mile Road Championships in Henderson, NV.

Joe Gray won the senior men's race to lead Team USA to gold at the Pan American Cross Country Championships. Also winning gold was Stanford's Connor Lane in the U20 Men's race. The U20 men and women took silver in the team standings, while the senior women claimed bronze.

March will be a busy month for the LDR community, with upcoming USATF championships in the 50K Road Championships (March 4, Long Island, NY), 15K championship at Gate River Run (March 10, Jacksonville), and Masters 8K championship (March 17; Virginia Beach). Team USA will do battle in Valencia, Spain at the IAAF World Half Marathon Championship on March 24.

Finally, it's with deep regret that I note the passing of Jonathan Grey. Jonathan Grey, the 2011 USATF National Club Cross Country Champion and a 2016 U.S. Olympic Marathon Trials qualifier, lost his battle with depression on February 10 a few days before his 30th birthday. Jonathan was a fierce competitor and a good friend. He will be missed.

Men's LDR Report

Men's LDR will be sending a team to Valencia, Spain for the World Half Marathon Championships. The team will be represented by Team Leader Ed Eyestone. The following will be Team USA: Leonard Korir, Sam Chelanga, Deigo Estrada, Benard Lagat, and Jared Ward. The alternate is Elkanah Kibet.

On the running circuit our next stop is the Jacksonville Gate River Run 15k. Austin, Atlanta, Chattanooga, and Orlando are our finalist to host the 2020 Olympic Marathon Trials. We are currently doing our site visits and will report to the board our findings in March.

We are excited to send five great athletes to Spain for the World Half Marathon. The team will be coached by Katie McGregor. The team members are Becky Wade, Elaina Tabb, Sara Hall, Jordan Hasay, and Natosha Rogers.

We look forward to our next US Championship at the Gate River Run in Jacksonville for the 15k.

A select committee is working hard to begin site visits for the Olympic Marathon trials site for 2020. More updates next month!

Masters LDR Report

2018 USATF Masters Cross Country Championships were held at Apalachee Regional Park in Tallahassee Florida; Women contested the

Championships over a 6 km course while the Men traversed an 8 km course. Kevin Castille ran away with the Overall Championship on the Men's side, winning by over 3 minutes in 24:19. He also captured the Age-grading crown with a 94.56%. Kent Lemme and Nat Larson finished 2nd and 3rd overall while Rick Becker and Larson took 2nd and 3rd in Age-Grading. The top three women ran in a tight pack until the final 1000 meters when Jennifer Bayliss pulled away to win by 4 seconds; Maggie Shearer took 2nd and Sonja Friend-Uhl 3rd. Age-Grading honors at 94.37% went to Sabra Harvey, with Marisa Sutera Strange and Doreen McCoubrie rounding out the podium. Women's team titles went to Pacific's Impala Racing Team (40 and up); Mid-Atlantic's Athena Track Club (50 and up); and Niagara's Genesee Valley Harriers (60 and up). Men's team titles were captured by New Jersey's Garden State Track Club-New Balance (40 and up); New England's Greater Springfield Harriers (50 and up); Georgia's Atlanta Track Club (60 and up); and Niagara's Genesee Valley Harriers (Men 70 and up).

Next Up: USATF Masters 8K Championship.

Please join us on March 17, 2018, St. Patrick's Day for this year's 8K National Championship hosted by the Shamrock/Towne Bank 8k in Virginia Beach, Virginia. The course is flat and fast; we anticipate many PR's and maybe even an American record or two. Masters Athletes line up at the front of the first corral and set the pace; after the race there is plenty of fun as Championship athletes join the crowds heading for the Yuengling's tent on the beach for Irish Stew and/or Beer. The Shamrock organization is handling the registration for the Masters Championship.

MUT approved two championships for 2019 during our
Executive Committee call on February 12:

the MUT liaison. Traci Falbo (17:03:15) and Jon Olsen

Cross Country Report

February was a busy month for cross country as both
the USA National Championships were held and the
USA National Team competed in the Pan Am Cross
Country Championships.

USA CROSS COUNTRY NATIONALS

The USA National Championships were held in
Tallahassee on Saturday, February 3. The day turned
out to be nearly perfect as the sun was out, but the
temperatures stayed cool. Championships were held in
six races; Men's and Women's Masters (40+), Juniors
(under 20), and Seniors. The event also serves as host
for the Men's and Women's Armed Forces
Championships, run within the Senior races.

The first race of the day was the Master's Women's 6k.
Californians Jennifer Bayless and Maggie Shearer
dueled throughout the race with Jennifer coming out on
top by a four second margin for the first place finish.
When age-graded, Sabra Harvey was the overall prize
winner with her 94% graded time of 26:32 easily taking
the win. Athena Track Club teammates Marisa Sutera
Strange and Doreen McCoubrie finished 2nd and 3rd in
the age-graded prize structure.

Next up were the Master's Men, who competed over an
8k distance. Kevin Castille, from Baton Rouge LA, was
an easy winner, both overall and age-graded. His 24:19
at age 45 dominated the competition and graded out to a
94%. Rick Becker, a common name at the top of cross
country championships for years from Club Northwest,
was second and Nat Larson was third, leading a very
competitive team of 50+ athletes for the Greater
Springfield Harriers.

Both Junior and Senior races were selection races for
the Pan Am Cross Country team. The Junior Women
(under 20) were up first, competing over the 6k course.
A three way battle quickly ensued between Northern
Illinois' Ashley Tutt and Duke teammates Amanda Beach
and Michaela Reinhart. Eventually, Ashley opened a
small gap over the duo from Duke and won in a time of
21:08 with Amanda second and Michaela third.
The Junior Men ran with a large, intact, lead pack for
much of the 8k course. Eventually, Stanford's Connor
Lane made a strong move to take the victory with a time
of 25:04. PAC-12 rival Tibebe Proctor, from
Washington, was eight seconds back in second.
Beginning in 2017, both the men and women run
championships over the 10k distance. In Tallahassee
the women were up first. The race turned into a stirring
dual between Emily Infeld and Molly Seidel. The duo
pulled away from the main pack before Emily used a
strong closing stretch to win by four seconds. It was her
first USATF national title.

Finally the men finished up the competition with their race over 10 kilometers. The field was very patient early on, with a large lead pack over the first 6k or so. Even entering the final 2k lap, many athletes looked to have a chance to finish on top. However, the much anticipated dual between Galen Rupp and Leonard Korir, both many time national champions, really got going over the final kilometer. Leonard opened the smallest of margins and held on for a one second victory over Galen. Behind them, the remainder of the lead pack had not broken up and the third through seventh finishers all came in within three seconds of each other.

Tallahassee once again proved to be a wonderful host for a cross country national championship event. The USA Cross Country Nationals will again be held in Tallahassee in 2019 and select the United States teams for the IAAF World Championships which will be held in Aarhus, Denmark.

PAN AM CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

El Salvador was the host country for the 2018 Pan Am (and NACAC) Cross Country Championships. The meet was held on February 17 at La Libertad. Junior and Senior Men and Women competed in the championship. The Junior Women (under 20) competed over a 6 kilometer course. Canada swept to victory while the United States ladies finished in second. Ashley Tutt, fresh off of her victory at the USA Nationals, was the top US finisher in sixth place. Amanda Beach also came away with a top ten finish with her eighth place effort. On the Junior Men's side the United States team also came away with a second place finish, behind champion Canada. However, this time the US garnered the individual title with Stanford's Connor Lane running 25:06 over the 8k course for a convincing 13 second victory. Michael Vernau also finished in the top ten with a time of 25:37 getting him eighth place.

The closest team competition of the day came in the senior women's 10k race. The United States battled with Canada and Peru for the Pan Am title. Peru finished with the victory, scoring 28 points and Canada nipped the United States by one point, 34-35, for second. Three US ladies finished in the top ten; Susan Tanui (4th, 35:22), Emily Durgin (6th, 35:34) and Katrina Spratford 10th, 36:13).

The United States did break through with a team victory in the Senior Men's 10k race. In fact, the US men dominated with four of the top five finishers, scoring a near perfect 12 points for the win. Leading the way was individual champion Joseph Gray. Gray, a veteran of many US national teams, won with a time of 30:02. Augustus Maiyo (2nd, 30:05), Abbabiya Simbassa (4th, 30:09) and Robert Cheseret (5th, 30:35) completed the team scoring for the champs.

With an experienced staff that included Fred Finke, Gwyn Coogan and Bill Roe, the trip went off without a hitch. The staff described the team as "one of the closest I have ever been on. It was a USA team from the time we met in Houston until we touched back down in Houston." Thanks go out to our El Salvador hosts for putting on a great Pan Am championship.
